Focus Groups were held at the center level within the months of September and November of 2015. These meetings were presented in order to provide parents and students with more information about the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) and our school-wide goals for the 2015-2016 school year. Additionally, parents and students were invited to provide feedback and engage in discussion around bettering our programs and supports for students.


20 Meetings were held throughout all regions with **554** parents & students in attendance.

An **Online Survey** was administered at the conclusion of each Focus Group Meeting as well as distributed to parents and students in a variety of ways throughout the Focus Group period. Through this survey, parents and students were again invited to provide feedback around bettering our programs and supports for students, particularly focusing on Common Core curriculum supports and post-graduation preparedness.



1,288 respondents contributed with feedback.

Identified Strengths


Positive and supportive environment between all stakeholders.

Strengthen curriculum & extra-curricular offerings to support all types of student goals after graduation, and provide more tracks/options for experience in various fields.



A fully-developed Career & Technical Education program is currently in development.



Some Career & Technical Education courses will be offered starting Fall 2016.
